

Approved Supplies

You may ONLY use the following materials in your sled build:

- Cardboard
- Duct tape
- Glue
- Pool noodles
- Wax
- Paint

No other materials or hardware may be used.

Rules & Regulations

Sled Construction

1. Sleds must be built entirely from approved materials only.
2. No wood, metal, plastic, screws, staples, or commercially made sled parts.
3. Pool noodles may be used for structure, edging, bumpers, or style.
4. Sleds cannot be wider than 6ft or longer than 10ft.
5. Wax may be used on the bottom to increase slide.

Paint is allowed for decoration only—no sealing or waterproofing products.

Safety Requirements

1. All riders must wear helmets (bike, ski, or snowboarding helmets accepted).
2. Minimum of 2 riders with a maximum of 6. No riders under the age of 3.
3. Sleds and teams must pass a safety inspection before they can race.
4. Sleds must not have sharp edges or protruding pieces.

Riders must be securely seated; no standing or kneeling unless approved at inspection.

Race Rules

1. Races will run between 2:00 and 3:15 PM.
2. Racers must start from the official start line—no running starts.
3. Each sled will be allowed **two runs**; best run counts.
4. To qualify as a finisher your entire team must be in the sled as it crosses the finish line, rather than chasing it or being chased by it.
5. Crashes happen, but intentional collisions or unsafe behavior will result in disqualification.
